

Minutes of the Annual Meeting for the Parish of Uggeshall held on Wednesday 8th March 2017 at 7.30 pm at the Church Room Uggeshall

Election of Chair for 2017/18

Cllr Fairhead proposed Cllr Hall seconded by Cllr Felgate, agreed unanimously, Cllr Hall agreed to another term as Chairman.

Minutes of the last APM were read and approved as a true record prop by Cllr Felgate seconded by Cllr Fairhead aif and signed by Cllr Hall.

Matters Arising

Two new heaters have been installed in the Church Room.

Cllr Hall has been finding prices for a new larger noticeboard, the cheapest being approximately £200, there was some discussion on the best size - probably one that holds 16 x A4 sheets - position and general weather resistance of a new one. Cllr Hall will look into things in more depth.

Group Chairman's Annual Report - read out.

Uggeshall Millenium Fund.

There is £2,557.26 in the fund, nothing has been paid out in this financial year and Cllr Hall expects another £900 approximately from tickets sales this year.

Mrs Ashton is the Treasurer for the fund, the income mainly comes from the sale of Latitude Tickets now. The Uggeshall Parish Councillors have the final decision on how this money is spent for the benefit of the Parish and Parishioners. Cllr Hall is owed some money from the fund for refreshments he bought for the last village party. Cllr Fairhead proposed that Parishioners are asked to put forward suggestions on where this year's money should go, Cllr Hall is to arrange an advert for the Messenger.

Uggeshall Parish Charities Accounts were received, and the Clerk apologised because she did not have them with her but will circulate them tomorrow. (Attached) The Charity was set up to help the needy of the Parish, of whom there few now.

There are several direction signs that appear to have been knocked down along the A12 between Wangford and Wrentham, the Clerk is to report the matter to Highways Dept.

A parishioner complained that he had not received a notification from the Planning Dept regarding the application for a new pig unit nearby, and that the silo can be seen from the road. D Cllr Rivett said that the application will be coming up again, as it had been built the wrong way round, the original plans showed the silo within the roofline, and the gentleman should contact WDC Planning with his views.
